Dear Mr. Clegg:

Thank you for the additional information you provided on May 13th concerning your Open Records Act Request. The Georgia Institute of Technology ("GIT") responds as follows:

- (A) Undergraduate Admissions does not have any records responsive to your request. The Graduate Admissions Office was contacted and is not aware of any responsive records, but is able to search their records further for an estimated cost of \$46.08 [estimated time of 3 hrs. @ \$15.36/hr. lowest paid employee capable of performing search/retrieval work]. There are approximately 100 graduate degree coordinators that may have responsive records, since admission decisions are made at the department level in each school/department. Since identifying the degree coordinators and obtaining estimates from approximately 100 people will likely take several hours, our estimate is \$155.76 (6 hrs. @ \$25.96) to compile the additional cost estimate. Each of those people will then then need to be contacted for responsive records and we will then be in a position to provide you with further cost estimate(s) for those records.
- (B) We believe that additional clarification is needed for (B). Although you've stated that the "context of your request is university admissions", we do not understand the type of records that you are seeking. Searching the term "mismatch" across campus and including all those involved with graduate and undergraduate admissions would be extremely time-consuming and likely very costly to you. GIT's "Factbook" [http://factbook.gatech.edu] will provide you with some statistics [see Enrollment and Admissions] that may be helpful to you. There is a lot of information available, including for past years [see Factbook Archives link on top left of webpage].

Please let me know if you'd like to proceed with any portion of your request, and also provide further clarification and/or narrowing of your (B) request if the Factbook information is not
