## VERIFIED PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

The California Cattlemen's Association (Petitioner, CCA, or Association), hereby petitions this Court for a Writ of Mandate pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure section 1085 declaring unlawful the actions of the California Department of Fish and Wildlife and Director Charlton Bonham (Respondents), in failing to conduct five-year status reviews of 233 species listed as "endangered" or "threatened" under the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). By failing to perform these five-year status reviews, Respondents have abdicated their mandatory, nondiscretionary duties under the CESA. Respondents' inaction in this regard constitutes (1) a clear violation of the plain language of the CESA, Fish and Game Code § 2077, and (2) an abuse of Respondents' discretion. On information and belief, Petitioner alleges as follows:

## INTRODUCTION

- 1. This Verified Petition for Writ of Mandate (Petition) challenges Respondents' failure to conduct mandatory five-year status reviews of species listed as "threatened" or "endangered" under section 2077 of the CESA.
- 2. Petitioner also challenges Respondents' failure to conduct mandatory five-year status reviews under the CESA as an abuse of discretion under section 1085 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.
- 3. Accordingly, Petitioner hereby seeks a writ of mandate (1) declaring that Respondents violated the CESA by failing to conduct 233 mandatory status reviews for species listed under the CESA; (2) declaring that Respondents abused their discretion by failing to conduct 233 mandatory status reviews for the species listed under the CESA; and (3) an order compelling Respondents to conduct mandatory five-year status reviews for the species listed under the CESA, including an order that the Respondents file a proposed schedule for completion of the status reviews for the court to approve as a mandatory deadline for completion.

## JURISDICTION AND VENUE

4. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure section 1085. Venue is proper pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure section 395.

## **PARTIES**

- 5. Petitioner, the CALIFORNIA CATTLEMEN'S ASSOCIATION, a California public interest organization, is a nonpartisan, nonprofit trade organization founded in 1917 to represent beef cattle producers in legislative and regulatory affairs. The association currently has over 3,000 individual members and 38 affiliated county or multi-county cattlemen's associations located throughout California. CCA has members in every county in California, and its members raise cattle in every county except for San Francisco. The beef cattle industry contributes over 26,000 jobs and more than \$1.5 billion annually to California's agricultural economy.
- 6. Beef cattle producers own or manage approximately 38-million acres within California. A substantial number of CCA members own or manage properties inhabited by species listed as either "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA. The status of at least 233 of these species has not been reviewed within the five-year period required by the CESA. The listing of these species as either threatened or endangered imposes burdens on the management of private properties used for grazing or restricted permitted grazing on lands owned by federal or state government. CCA members are dependent on these properties to maintain economically viable agricultural operations, and restrictions due to the mislisting of species as either threatened or endangered under the CESA has significant impacts on the ability of these individuals to responsibly use their own resources and sustain their livelihoods. Consequently, CCA and its members have an interest in ensuring that the status of listed species is reviewed in accordance with the CESA.
- 7. CCA's interest in ensuring that the status reviews of species listed under the CESA are conducted in accordance with California law is germane to the Association's mission of maintaining economially viable agricultural operations. In addition to bringing this lawsuit on behalf of itself, CCA brings this lawsuit on behalf of its members, who are themselves injured by

the Department's failure to conduct mandatory status reviews of at least 233 species listed under the CESA. Moreover, individual participation of CCA's members is not necessary since the Association is requesting prospective injunctive relief, which will inure to the benefit of CCA's members.

- 8. Therefore, the Association files this Petition on its own behalf and on behalf of its members and supporters, and all others similarly situated.
- 9. The Association, its members, and the members of the public have a substantial, beneficial interest in the relief that is sought, and have a present interest, as California citizens, in the enforcement of the State's public duties under the APA, and in the State's duties to conduct five-year status reviews under the California Endangered Species Act.
- 10. The Association seeks to compel Respondents to comply with the CESA and conduct mandatory five-year status reviews of at least 233 species listed as "threatened" or endangered" under the CESA. Respondents are expending substantial resources to enforce the prohibitions and restrictive provisions of the CESA and to promulgate and administer recovery plans for these unreviewed species even though they may not require listing at all. Also, by failing to conduct these status reviews, Respondents lack the knowledge required to provide additional protection to species whose status should be changed from threatened to endangered. Thus, Respondents have ignored their responsibility under the CESA, injuring the association, the association's members, and the public as a result.
- 11. Respondent CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE (Department), formerly known as the Department of Fish and Game, is the California state public agency charged with managing California's diverse fish, wildlife, and plant resources, including the habitats upon which they depend, for their ecological value and for their use and enjoyment by the public. § 2077. The Department is required, by statute, to establish a list of endangered species and a list of threatened species. § 2070. The Department is responsible for performing five-year status reviews of listed species. § 2077.
- 12. Respondent Charlton Bonham (Director) is sued in his official capacity as Director of the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. The Director's responsibilities include

administering the CESA for the benefit of species and the public, as well as in compliance with those provisions of the CESA which protect property owners such as Petitioner's members, including insuring that status reviews of species currently listed pursuant to § 2070 are conducted.

## BACKGROUND

- 13. The California Legislature enacted the CESA to "conserve endangered species and threatened species." § 2055.
- 14. As a part of this program, Respondents have the statutory authority to list a species as either "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA. § 2070.
- 15. The CESA defines "endangered species" as a native species or subspecies that is in serious danger of becoming extinct through all, or a significant portion of, its range due to one or more causes, including loss of habitat. § 2062.
- 16. The CESA defines "threatened species" as a native species or subspecies that, although not presently threatened with extinction, is likely to become an endangered species in the foreseeable future in the absence of special protection and management efforts. § 2067.
- 17. Respondents are required to conduct, at least once every five years, a status review of all species listed as "threatened" or "endangered," and must determine whether any such species should be: removed from such list, changed in status from an endangered species to a threatened species, or changed in status from a threatened species to an endangered species. § 2077.
- 18. Pursuant to the listing authority in § 2070, Respondents or their predecessors have listed hundreds of species as either "endangered" or "threatened" under the CESA. The list of plants listed as "endangered" or "threatened" under the CESA is available at https://nrm.dfg.ca.gov/FileHandler.ashx?DocumentID=109390&inline. The list of animals listed as "endangered" or "threatened" under the CESA is available at https://nrm.dfg.ca.gov/FileHandler.ashx?DocumentID=109405&inline.

19. On information and belief, although § 2077 requires Respondents to conduct status reviews for every species listed as "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA for at least five years, Respondents have only conducted a five-year status review for two of those species that have been listed for more than five years: the Swainson's hawk and the California least tern.

20. On information and belief, Respondents have not conducted the mandatory five-year status review for any of the other 233 species that have been listed for at least five years as "endangered" or "threatened."

## **Overdue Status Reviews**

- 21. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has listed the species in the following paragraphs as either "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA. Each listing has been in place for five or more years.
- 22. The dates in the following paragraphs denote the date on which the California Department of Fish and Wildlife listed the species as "threatened" or "endangered." If there are multiple list dates (for example, if a species was initially listed as "threatened" and then listed as "endangered"), the most recent date is used.
- 23. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has not conducted a status review of any of the species listed in the following paragraphs since January 1, 2011.
- 24. Several of the species listed in the CESA and for which a status review has not been conducted in the previous five years — have been reclassified or recommended for reclassification under the Federal ESA by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The species include the San Clemente Island Indian Paintbrush (see specific allegation in ¶ 56 below), San Clemente Island larkspur (see ¶ 77), Santa Cruz Cypress (see ¶ 101), Beach Layia (see ¶ 106), San Clemente Island bush-mallow (see ¶ 116), Modoc Sucker (see ¶ 185), and Least Bell's vireo (see  $\P$  213).

## **Endangered Plants (132 species)**

25. The San Mateo thorn-mint was listed as an endangered species in July 1979. It remains listed as an endangered species. On information and belief, Respondents have not yet conducted a status review since January 1, 2011 as is required by § 2077.

259. Respondents have a mandatory and nondiscretionary duty under the CESA to revie
listed species at least every five years. § 2077.

- 260. The species noted in paragraphs 25 through 257 of this Petition have been listed as either "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA since January 1, 2011, but Respondents have failed to review any of these species within the last five years as required by § 2077.
- 261. Respondents' failure to conduct a status review of any of these listed species violates the CESA and is unlawful.

## SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

## (CCP § 1085—Abuse of discretion)

- 262. Petitioner realleges, as though set forth in full, each and every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 261 inclusive.
- 263. Respondents have a mandatory and nondiscretionary duty under the CESA to review species listed as "threatened" or "endangered" under the CESA at least every five years. § 2077.
- 264. The species noted in paragraphs 25 through 257 of this Petition have been listed since January 1, 2011, but Respondents have failed to review any of these species.
- 265. Respondents abused their discretion, and acted arbitrarily and capriciously without evidentiary support, by failing to conduct status reviews as mandated by § 2077.

## PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays for judgment as follows:

- 1. For a writ of mandate declaring that Respondents violated § 2077 and abused their discretion by failing to conduct mandatory status reviews of the species list in paragraphs 25 through 257.
- 2. For a writ of mandate directing the Respondents to conduct the status reviews mandated by § 2077, including an order that the Respondents file a proposed schedule for completion of the mandatory status reviews for the court to approve as a mandatory deadline for completion.
- 3. For costs of suit, including reasonable attorneys' fees; and
