How Discriminatory Mandates Prevent Qualified Individuals from Serving on Tennessee Public Boards

What's at Stake?

Government boards regulate countless professions in Tennessee. Whereas most boards require their members to meet reasonable requirements, several Tennessee statutes require the governor to appoint board members on the basis of race or sex. These provisions have nothing to do with the profession being regulated and everything to do with identity politics.

The Fourteenth Amendment guarantees equal protection under the law, yet these quotas require overt discrimination against certain individuals regardless of their choices, character, or ability and keep qualified individuals off public boards for the sake of race- or sex-based balance.

Solution

Pacific Legal Foundation is suing the governor of Tennessee on behalf of Do No Harm, a nonprofit organization of more than 6,000 physicians, healthcare professionals, medical students, patients, and policymakers committed to ensuring equality in healthcare.

This federal lawsuit challenges the race-based membership quota of the Tennessee Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners on the grounds that it violates the Constitution's guarantee of equal protection. Victory would ensure that all candidates can compete equally to serve on the board, regardless of their race.

However, Tennessee legislators don't have to wait on the court. They should reform the state's biased laws now, ending race- and sex-based discrimination in public board membership.
